

## Sr. Eileen's Cúinne

An Ceathrú Domhnach den Aidbhint

Inniu an ceathrú Domhnach den Aidbhint agus ceiliúrfar Breith Íosa ar fud an domhain ar an gCéadaoin seo chugainn. Tá an feitheamh thart nach mór agus comhlíonadh na Nollag buailte linn. "Seo mar a deir an Tiarna: "Tusa, a Bethlehem Efrata, bíodh is gur beag le rá thú i measc treibheanna Judah, is asat-sa a thiocfaidh, dom-sa, an té a bheidh os cionn Israel" (Micah 5:2)

Is féidir linn teachtaireacht na Nollag a mheabhrú dúinn féin agus machnamh a dhéanamh ar an gcéad Nollaig.
