Féile Chorp Chríost (Corpus Christi)

Thug Íosa a Chorp agus a Fhuil dúinn mar lón anama. Bhunaigh Sé an Eocairist Naofa ar Dhéardaoin na Páise ag an suipéar deireanach leis na hAspail.
