Friday 29th November Feast of St. Brendan of Birr



Saint Brendan of Birr (died c. 572) was one of the early Irish monastic saints. He was a monk and later an abbot, of the 6th century. He is known as "St Brendan the Elder" to distinguish him from his contemporary and friend St Brendan the Navigator of Clonfert. He was one of the Twelve Apostles of Ireland, a friend and disciple of Saint Columba.

He founded the monastery at Birr in about 540, serving as its abbot. He emerges from early Irish writings as a man of generous hospitality with a reputation for sanctity and spirituality who was an intuitive judge of character. He was considered one of the chief prophets of Ireland. His friendship and support for Columba resulted in important connections between Birr and the Columban foundations.

New Book Celebrates St. Brendan's R.C. Church's 200th Anniversary

On 1st of August 2024 St. Brendan's R.C. Church celebrated the bicentenary of its completion, on 1st August 1824. Over 20 decades the church has been at the center of life for the Roman Catholic population of Birr Parish. It was one of the first Irish R.C. churches to be completed on such a scale since the relaxation of penal laws. In 1824 Roman Catholic and dissenter populations were tolerated if they kept things below the radar. St. Brendan's however, with its gothic revival architecture and 124 feet 6-inch spire certainly was not below the radar. It was also built in a most prominent position overlooking the weir on the Cam Cor River. This was thanks to the local landlord Laurence Parsons, 2nd Earl of Rosse. Laurence not only donated the site but contributed £100 and a quarry of stone to complete the building. It is safe to say that the 2nd Earl of Rosse was a truly ecumenical gentleman who was a leading light in the realms of tolerance and inter-community relations. This is just one aspect of the building's history recorded for posterity by local historian and pastoral council chairperson Brian Kennedy, in his new book 'A Place in All Our Hearts.'

The book with a myriad of pictures of the building will be launched in St. Brendan's Church, by Bishop Fintan Monaghan, on 29th November next, at 7.30 p.m. The launch will take place in the context of an Ecumenical Service to mark the Feast of St. Brendan of Birr, to whom the church is dedicated.

Feast of Christ Our King

A new Liturgical Year begins and our attention is focused on God's plan when His kingdom will come and we and our people will be with Jesus Christ in heaven, remembering that His life ended on the cross but today we honour Him as the Risen King.
